Helping the Clerk



You've done a good job figuring out the cost of your supplies and deciding whether to buy them in camp or walk to town. Now you can try one of these activities.

- 1. Write a letter home that explains your financial decisions throughout the season. Tell your family these things.
 - Your monthly pay;
 - Your gross pay for the season;
 - What items you bought and their prices;
 - Why you needed the items;
 - Where you bought the items and why you bought them there.

Give a complete account of your earnings and your take-home pay.

- 2. After calculating your take-home pay, figure out how much less you would get if you cash the check early at a saloon in town that charges a 10% fee. Also figure out how much less you would get if the saloon charges a fee of 7.5%, or 12.5%, or 15%.
- 3. Find a shortcut way to figure out 10% of your take-home pay. This shortcut might involve moving the decimal point, or dividing. Use your shortcut to find your take-home pay after the saloon takes a 10% fee. Once you know what 10% of your take-home pay is, and what 7.5% of your take-home pay is, what shortcuts could you use to find 12.5% and 15% of your take-home pay? Be ready to explain your shortcuts to your class.
- 4. Do you think it is fair for a saloon to charge a fee to cash a lumberjack's check early? Explain why or why not.
